<b>contemporary</b>	belonging to the present time
<b>tempestuous</b>	turbulent; stormy
<b>extemporaneous</b>	made or delivered on the spur of the moment
<b>tempo</b>	speed of music
<b>temporary</b>	not permanent
<b>temporize</b>	to act evasively in order to gain time
<b>contemporaneous</b>	happening at or around the same time
<b>contretemps</b>	an embarrassing occurrence
